JEWISH LEADER DIES OF ATTACK

Stricken with a heart attack Dave Maidenberg, a Gas City retailer for many years and a leader in the Marion Jewish community, died at 3:30 a.m. today at Marion General Hospital. He was admitted to the hospital only a few hours before his death.

Funeral services will be held at 10 a.m. Wednesday at 504 West Third street and will be in charge of Rabbi Dave Gorfinkle of Fort Wayne. Burial will be in the IOOF cemetery.

Born in Russia 65 years ago, Mr. Maidenberg has resided in Marion for the last 44 years. He established a retail store at Gas City 35 years ago but maintained his home here at 814 West Third street.

He was a member of Sinai Temple and was president of the orthodox synagogue. He also was a trustee of B'nai B'rith lodge and was a member of the board of directors of the Marion Jewish Federation.

Members of the family said he had not been ill. He was stricken at his home Sunday night and was taken almost immediately to the hospital.

He is survived by his widow, Rose; four sons, Meyer, Milton and Frank, all of Marion, and Ben, Arkon, O., sister, Esther Rosen, Regina, Sask., and seven grandchildren.
